The boys did reasonably well under very difficult conditions to post a score of 101 for the first innings. With more aggressive running between the wickets the score could have been much higher. The Crusaders did well just to land the ball on the pitch with the wind blowing strongly across the field all day. That made scoring difficult as well and accounted for the high number of extras. We made a nervous start before Angad Malhotra was run out off a direct hit for 1 leaving us 1-11. We had several useful partnerships: 19 Crouch/Dhaliwal, 20 Bartlett/Gholkar, 19 Gholkar/Penna but no one went on and made a big score. We were also disappointed we didn't bat out our overs. Nathan Penna made a great debut, top scoring with 11, including several cracking boundaries.

We then had 8 overs at the Crusaders before stumps. Angad Malhotra had a good opening spell, 4 overs-2 maidens-0/4. Our fielding was a little sloppy and they finished the day at 0-24. Not a bad start for the boys considering we had the bye first up.

Unbelievably we were able to complete the match this Saturday considering the wet weather. AKA Crusaders got away with a first innings win passing our score with the loss of only two wickets. Unfortunately we were unable to break their opening partnership until it had contributed 87 runs to the total with one of their openers contributing a half century.

Despite already having lost the first innings the boys never gave up and managed to snare the last 8 wickets for only 47 runs bowling them out in the 47th over! If we had been able to break their opening partnership earlier it may have been a different result.

All 11 players got a bowl and all performed very well. Shantaam Dar returned the best figures with an inspired 3 for 16 off 4 overs. We had 6 wicket takers in all, a great effort. Of the 5 boys who didn't take a wicket two of them took catches and two had run outs. The other 6 dismissals were bowled, which demonstrated to the boys the value of bowling straight. Interestingly we had exactly the same number of sundries their bowlers had last week.

It was a great TEAM effort and I was very proud of the boys performance in their first match. I think if we can be a more aggressive in our running between the wickets and reduce our sundries we will go very well this season.

This was followed by several terrific overs of threatening deliveries from both boys with Ikteeda hardly bowling a bowl off the stumps. Rewards were a plenty for such good bowling too with Ikteeda picking up 3 wickets, all bowled and Jake grabbing one with a genuine edge that was caught behind by Daniel Waddups. KL were left reeling with the score at 4 for 8 after eight 8 overs and only one sundry had been bowled – what a start! A coach's dream!

Jason Luther and Nathan Hamilton were next and although there was some wayward bowling amongst the next few overs, each also bowled some great deliveries that made scoring off the bat quite difficult for KL. Nathan picked up one wicket during this spell to make it 5 for 30 in the 13th over and KL were now in some serious trouble, no doubt foreign territory for them given their first round victory.

Brad Ripps and Chris Blinman were the third bowling pair and thankfully sundries slowed and chances and half chances seemed plentiful. Unfortunately neither could manage to get a wicket although both were very unlucky not to get at least one or two. Together, Brad and Chris slowed KL's scoring rate to a near crawl and reapplied the pressure started by our opening pair. Michael Bellam and Jimmy Gardiner followed on and continued to apply the pressure on KL's batsmen. Eventually the pressure became too much and three more wickets fell, two to Jimmy and one to Michael, reducing KL's score to 8 for 85 in the 31st over.

Ramal Rajapakse and Luke McGuinness wrapped up the innings with short spells of bowling, Luke getting one wicket with a great delivery that smashed into middle stump. Shortly after Luke scored a direct-hit run out and wrapped up KL's innings for 115 runs in the 37th over.

In some respects the bowling performance this game was an improvement on Game 1 with the sundries rate improved by 14% (8 wides and 20 no-balls – more improvement still needed) and the attacking nature of some bowlers absolutely fantastic. Disappointingly though we seem to let KL off the hook on at least two occasions during their innings with 115 runs a good result but too much considering they were 5 for 22 early on. As the season progresses it will be important to finish teams off when opportunities arise, as these games are where you get your chances for second inning play and bonus outright points.

Still having some 35 minutes left in the day KL bowled 12 overs at us in an attempt to knock over as many wickets as they

could before stumps and to hopefully leave us a little nervous for the week to follow. KL bowled exceptionally well and used five bowlers in just 12 overs to keep our batsmen from getting comfortable. This worked to some extent as they managed to claim 2 wickets (Jimmy for 6 and Jake for 18) before play was closed at a score of 2 for 32. Jason Luther and Daniel Waddups steadied the ship after the loss of two wickets, each boy batting very sensibly, defending when necessary and leaving everything else alone with a view to surviving until next week. Unfortunately, neither boy got to continue their innings as day two was washed out due to persistent rain. No doubt both sides were confident of a win but I'm certain that KL would have been hard to beat on the day. All up a draw was probably a good result for both teams, each able to take some confidence out of a very competitive game of cricket.
