This match underlined what could have been for the team this season. Baulkham Hills batted first and looked to be building towards a significant first innings score having reached 4 for 121, with Christian Mulder making a classy 46 in his first match since breaking his finger in early October 2009. However, once he was the fifth batsman out at 121, some indiscreet shot selection saw the team slump to be all out for 137. This left Rouse Hill with around 1.75 hours to bat on the first day. Some good accurate bowling backed up in the field saw the game evenly poised at stumps with Rouse Hill on 7 for 105 requiring a further 33 runs for 1st innings points.

The Baulko effort picked up on the second day where it left off on day 1 to take the final 3 Rouse Hill wickets for 18 runs, all out 123, a lead of 14 runs on the first innings. Reece Jones finished with 3 for 46, Adarsh Subramaniam 2 for 25, and Troy Mulder 2 for 20. Matt Toomey and Chris Soares also bowled with good economy to take a wicket each.

With plenty of time remaining, Rouse Hill sent Baulko back to the crease, no doubt eager to take quick wickets and set up a run chase for outright victory.
