However, the As were quickly in trouble slumping to 3 for 7 and then 8 for 32, before a determined 9th wicket partnership of 25 between Bryce Jones and Troy Mulder took up some valuable time. The As were finally dismissed for 60, leaving the Bs around 30 minutes to score the 98 runs needed for an outright win. This was never a likely prospect and the Bs reached 3 for 45 at the close of play.

A well-deserved victory on the first innings to the As, consistent with the tenacity displayed in the second half of the season and again highlighting what might have been had the team not been disrupted by injury.
